



Mr. Charles "Chuck" Hebert

October 1, 1939 - September 1, 2018

On Saturday, September 1, 2018, Charles "Chuck" Morris Hebert, husband, father, and grandfather, passed away at the age of 78. Chuck will be forever remembered by his wife and best friend, Louise Hebert; their daughter, Amy Van Meter and husband Ashley Van Meter; his three beautiful granddaughters, Grayson, Ryane, and Lilly Van Meter. Chuck will also be remembered by his extended family, dear friends, and trusted colleagues. Chuck was born October 1, 1939 in Shreveport, LA and was the only child of Wilbert "Buster" and Doris Hebert of Carthage, Texas.

Chuck grew up in Carthage and graduated from Carthage High School in 1957. After graduation, Chuck attended Louisiana State University graduating in 1961. While at LSU, Chuck was a member of the ROTC, ROTC Band, and Sigma Chi Fraternity. After graduating from LSU, Chuck served his country admiralty as a pilot in the Air Force and was honorably discharged after several years of service to our country.

Chuck spent over 40 years in the banking industry and became a recognized authority in many aspects of the banking world. His sought after talents took him to many places, Tulsa, Dallas, Jacksonville, New York, Puerto Rico, and most recently the booming town of Snyder, Texas. During his time in banking, Chuck was always a voice of conservative reason, and a trusted advisor to those he came in contact with.

“ My memories and contacts with Chuck and his parents, Doris and Buster, go back to 1947. My family moved from Shreveport to Carthage in 1945 and two years later, the Heberts became Carthage residents. My parents both attended LSU during the same time Doris and Buster were students there. I never have understood how both families wound up in Carthage at about the same time, but I'm glad they did. The Heberts were our good friends for many years, resulting in the formation of many good memories for me. Chuck was my roommate during our freshman year at Stephen F. Austin, so he and I got to know each other very well. I remember that he was a good musician, favoring the saxophone. I endured his musical inclinations while he unenthusiastically accepted my leanings toward country music, with each of us espousing, rather strongly at times, the superior qualities of our individual preferences. Buster Hebert gave me my first job, which was as a weekend sales clerk and tire changer in his Western Auto Store, so Chuck and I were co-workers during those times. We delivered many refrigerators, chest freezers, and air conditioners during some very hot, Texas summer days. That job went a long way towards meeting some of my expenses at SFA. Chuck and I maintained contact off and on through the years. One summer, probably in 1957, he traveled to Tennessee and spent a week visiting our family.
