



## Rev. Charles Wilbur Danheim

Charles Wilbur Danheim died peacefully at Mother Frances Hospital in Tyler, Texas on January 13, 2021. He was preceded in death by his wife of 63 years, Mary Lou Goines Danheim.

He strongly believed in the United Methodist Church, the Book of Discipline and the mission of the Church.

Charles and Mary Lou retired to their home outside Mount Enterprise, Texas and enjoyed many years of traveling all over the U.S. together. After years of traveling, they settled into life as active attendee's at Garrison UMC until their
