Mr. Charles David "Boo Hoo" Hillin was born December 19, 1928 at his family home in Beckville, Texas. He passed this life November 16, 2020 in Carthage, Texas. Charles was born to the marriage of Oscar Howard and Willie Mae Guinn Hillin. He was raised and schooled in Beckville and served his country through the U.S. Marine Corp. He married Betty Jane Spann October 24, 1955 and they celebrated 58 years of marriage before she preceded him in death in 2013.
