



Mr. Ervin White

September 17, 1926 - August 13, 2016

Funeral services for Mr. Ervin White, 89, of Carthage, Texas, will be at 2:00 p.m., Wednesday, August 17, 2016, at the First Christian Church with Rev. Don Cocklin officiating. Burial will follow in the Restland Memorial Park Cemetery under the direction of Hawthorn Funeral Home. Visitation will be 1-2:00 p.m. prior to the service. Mr. White died August 13, 2016, in Carthage, Texas.

Mr. William Ervin White was born September 17, 1926, in the Murvaul Community of Panola County, Texas. He was one of six children born to the marriage of James William and Alice Green Moore White. He was raised and schooled in Gary and served his country through the U. S. Navy during WWII as a petty officer on a minesweeper aboard the U.S.S. Burleigh. He married Dora Elizabeth Childs June 18, 1948, and together they raised two children in a loving home. Mr. White retired from SWEPCO after forty years of service.

Mr. White was a member of the First Christian Church of Carthage where he served as an elder, and he and Elizabeth were the first couple to marry in the sanctuary. Ervin served as a Shriner and was a member of the Carthage Masonic Lodge #521 where he received his 60-year pin, after serving as both Worshipful Master and District Deputy Grand Master. He loved his farm and cows, playing bridge, 42 and traveling with Elizabeth. He is preceded in death by his parents, wife, Elizabeth White, brother, George White, sisters, Louise Rhodes, Martha Roberts and Mattie Mae White, and great granddaughter, Adalynn Grace Swinchatt.
