Mr. Gilford Franklin "Frank" Bozeman was born August 4, 1934 in Shreveport, Louisiana. Frank was one of twelve children born to James Richard and Lillie Mae Hudson Bozeman. Mr. Bozeman worked for 40 years with the Southern Pacific Railroad where he started out on the spikes and retired as a Senior Manager of Environmental for Utility and Electrical. Frank served his country through the United States Navy during the Korean Conflict. He married Merle Jan Sutton on May 24, 1957 and together they celebrated 31 years until she preceded him in death on January 2, 1989. He later married Norma Jean Martin Williams on December 6, 2001 and they celebrated 15 years together. Frank was a member of the Spring Baptist Church in Spring. He is also preceded in death by his parents and ten siblings.

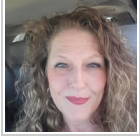
