Funeral services for Mr. James Kersh, 74 of Carthage, Texas will be 10:00 a.m., Wednesday, July 17, 2013 in the Hawthorn Funeral Home Chapel. Mr. Kersh passed away July 14, 2013 in Carthage.

Mr. James Rex Kersh was born January 24, 1939 in Shreveport, Louisiana. He was the only child born to the marriage of James Clayton and Ella Mae Reed Kersh. James was raised and schooled in Panola County and graduated from Carthage High School and later received his Bachelor of Science and Masters of Education degrees from Stephen F. Austin State University. He began his teaching career in 1960 and taught in New Caney, Brenham, Kaufman Boling and Wharton. However, Mr. Kersh spent most of his career teaching primary English in Carthage. James was extremely proud of the fact that his great, great, great grandfather was Isaac Reed, who established the first Baptist church in Texas, the Old North Church outside of Nacogdoches, and shortly afterwards established Bethel Baptist Church in Clayton. Mr. Kersh was very interested in the history of his family and was extremely pleased to discover that on the Kersh side of the family that he had ancestors who fought in the American Revolution, the War of 1812 and the Civil War for the Confederacy. He is preceded in death by his parents.

Mr. Kersh is survived by numerous cousins on both sides of the family.
