Mr. Leon Clarence Lewis was born December 28, 1932 in Eustace, Texas and passed away July 27, 2018 at his home in Carthage. Leon was one of five children born to Hubert and Dona Bell Reynolds Lewis. He was raised and schooled in Eustace and graduated from Eustace High School in 1947. After graduating, Leon served his country through the U.S. Army.
