Mrs. Anderson was born October 6, 1922 to Byron and Lila B. Fite Ross in Carthage, Texas. She passed away on July 1, 2014 in Carthage, Texas.

A life-long resident of Carthage, Mrs. Anderson graduated in 1939 from Carthage High School and went to work at the County Clerk's office. In 1944 she joined the staff of First National Bank of Carthage as Secretary where she was trained in all positions in the bank. She was named president of the bank in 1976, and in 1980 left the bank as President and Vice-Chairman of the Board of Trustees.

Mrs. Anderson was christened as an infant at First United Methodist Church and in 1932 became a member where she continued to worship until her death. She held various positions within the church, was a member of WMU, Team Mates Sunday School, and a member of Keenagers. She was active in the Altrusa Club, the National Association of Bank Women and in the Panola County Chamber of Commerce. She established a scholarship in memory of her parents Byron and Lila B. Fite Ross at Panola Junior College. Mrs. Anderson actively supported Mission Carthage and the Methodist Children's Home.

Mrs. Anderson is preceded in death by her parents Byron and Lila B. Fite Ross; husband Wm. Robert Taylor in 1968 and James S. Anderson in 1995, and a grandson, James "Ross" Anderson.

She is survived by one son, Spencer Anderson and wife, Deborah of Marshall; one daughter, Sidney Outlaw of College Station; grandsons, Brian Anderson of Longview and Ray Stanford, III of Vilas, N. Carolina; aunt, Louise LeBlanc of Carthage and cousins, Lynn Heines and husband John of Tyler; Nancy Tiller and husband Phillip; Merrell Rhodes, Betty Pippen, and Georgia Underwood all of Carthage, Gwen Wynn of Levelland, and Sara Burroughs of Shreveport, Louisiana.
