



## Chaplain Matt Williams

Memorial funeral services for Chaplain Matt Williams, 64, of the Triple Cross Ministries of Mt. Mr. Matt Voight Williams was born July 21, 1956 in Golden Meadow, Louisiana. He passed this life August 23, 2020 in Henderson, Texas. Matt completed his seminary instruction and served through the prison system. In the last year of his prison ministry he helped baptize 2,200 men with Chaplain Grasty of the Gurney Unit. As chaplain of Triple Cross Ministries, he brought thousands of men to know Jesus.

Matt leaves behind a great testimony and every stray dog that made it to the Triple Cross Ministry; Job, Amos, Gurly, Boaz, Little Mac, Hagai, and Bug found a home. Matt was a loving son, brother, and friend. He served as vice president of the Corp of Encouragers Christian Biker Ministers.

Mr. Williams is survived by his sister, Kelly W. Dennard of Mt. Enterprise; brother, Michael Todd Williams of Mt. Enterprise; numerous nieces, nephews, and a host of friends.
