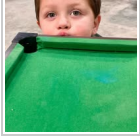

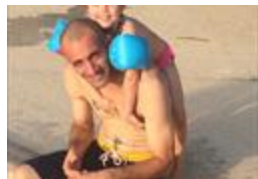

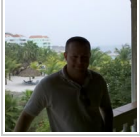

Tell him how his friendship made your life richer and how there's no way you could tell your life story without mentioning him.

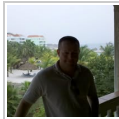

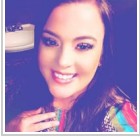
