Truman Adois Stanley (TA) was born on Aug. 18, 1925 in Cleburne, Texas. He passed away at 96 years of age on October 23, 2021. He survived his first wife, Willie Lois (Ammons) Stanley and second wife Maxine (Messer) Stanley. Truman had two sons, Truman (TR) Stanley and Terry Lee Stanley.

Truman was a fantastic visual story teller with an infectious sense of humor. He told stories about the model T his family had, how he and his brothers tamed a mean billy goat, the cows he raised, and traveling for farm work during the Great Depression. He was drafted for WWII, but was dismissed due to his large flat feet. Truman opened A&B Lawn Mower and Bike shop on White Settlement Rd in Ft. Worth, Tx in the 1970's and served as an assistant pastor in a local church. He continued to work on mowers, bikes and soul winning into his late 80's. Truman's passion was preaching the gospel of Christ. It was important to him to share that Christ did not come to condemn the world but to save it. He often quoted Romans 8.

Truman leaves to cherish his memory; his son and three grandchildren: TR Stanley, Connie (Stanley) Mitchell, Justin Stanley, and Joel Mitchell, as well as niece Jo (English) Kinman and numerous other nieces and nephews.

Truman did not wish any funeral arrangements, but desired his loved ones to rejoice in his journey to paradise with his Savior.

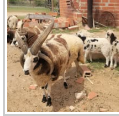
